## **Pupils**

All pupils are expected to

- Respect other pupils, staff, visitors and themselves and be aware that racism, intolerance and bullying are unacceptable in our school
- Wear the required uniform
- Engage in home learning
- Respect Health and Safety regulations
- Attend school regularly and punctually, adequately prepared for the school day
- Behave in a self disciplined manner at all times and obey the school rules

Pupils can expect from the school

- To have home learning looked at
- To have frequent feedback on their progress
- To have their behaviour monitored and appropriate disciplinary action taken when it falls short of the required standard
- To have their parents regularly informed of progress
- Not to be bullied
- To have a safe and caring environment to work in
- To have advice, care and support when needed from all staff

## **Parents and carers**

Each parent and carer has an important responsibility to work closely with their children and the staff and support their school achievements

We ask parents and carers

- To ensure your child attends regularly and punctually as required by law

- Not to take holidays in school time where possible
- To provide time and opportunity to encourage home learning

To take an interest in your child's school work

- To read all school communication and make contact with staff where appropriate
- To attend Parents` Evenings to meet your child's teachers

- To support the school rules and discipline code and reinforce actions taken by the school in terms of behaviour management
- To ensure your child gets adequate sleep before a school day
- To send your child to school, prepared for the school day with all books and equipment
- To support the school aim for healthy eating
