Anti-Bullying Week & Odd Socks Day

We will be taking part in Anti-Bullying Week this half term, which will take place from **Monday 13th – Friday 17th November**.

Verwood C of E First School and Nursery is committed to providing a caring and friendly environment for all our children so that they can learn in a safe atmosphere. Anti-Bullying awareness is always a focus and we incorporate it into our PSHE lessons, worships and class discussions on a regular basis. We also celebrate anti-bullying week every year; it gives schools an opportunity to think about the impact that bullying can have and what to do if you're worried about bullying.

Anti-bullying week is coordinated by the Anti-Bullying Alliance, which is based at leading children's charity the National Children's Bureau. This year they have worked with children and young people up and down England, Wales and Northern Ireland to decide the theme, which is 'Make a Noise About Bullying'.

During this week, we will specifically be exploring how we can make a difference if we make a noise to stop bullying. We will be discussing what we mean by bullying behaviour, how we can tell the difference between 'banter' and bullying and how we can take action to stop bullying.

Anti-Bullying Week will start with **Odd Socks Day** on **Monday 13th November**, where children, staff and parents are invited to wear odd socks to celebrate what makes us all unique. Let's pull on odd socks to show we're ALL unique and let's be kind to each other and respect each other's individuality.

Half Termly R Focus

This half term the R we will be exploring in greater detail is RESILIENCE. We started our week talking about resilience and discussing the importance of trying hard and not giving up when times are tough. The children are building upon what they already know about resilience and further developing their understanding of how to be more resilient when faced with a challenge.

Being resilient means being ready, willing and able to learn and sustain concentration. We will be reflecting on how to be resilient through exploring the following behaviours:

- Absorption Being able to lose yourself in learning becoming absorbed in what you are doing; fascinated and attentive, in a state of 'flow'.
- Managing Distractions Recognising and reducing distractions; knowing when to walk away and refresh yourself. Creating your own best environment for learning.
- Noticing Perceiving subtle differences, patterns and details in experience.
- Perseverance Keeping going even in the face of difficulties, channelling the energy of frustration productively. Knowing what a slow and uncertain process learning often is.

How you can help at home

It's so important for children to be able to have opportunities to think about how they are learning. Learning how to learn will prepare children for the future, equipping them to become motivated and enthusiastic life-long learners.

Please take opportunities to talk about how your resilience has been tested and discuss examples of when each of you have found yourself in 'Challenge Ocean' (a place where mistakes will be experienced but ideas for becoming 'unstuck' will be developed).

If your child becomes stuck in their learning, ask them to think of what they would have to do at school to get 'unstuck'.

Don't rush to protect them too soon from difficulty. Do just enough to get them going again when stuck; for example don't finish the jigsaw puzzle yourself.

Involve them in your own learning activities. Try to 'think aloud' as you experience struggle with a new activity. It helps children grow if they see that you too can struggle with uncertainties and cope with them.

Build your child's resilience through telling stories - The Dot by Peter H. Reynolds or How to Catch a Star by Oliver Jeffers are some favourites.
