#### Health

We have a confirmed case of scarlet fever within School, although scarlet fever is usually a mild illness, it should be treated with antibiotics to minimise the risk of complications and reduce the spread to others.

Please click <u>here</u> to take you through to further information from the NHS, which includes symptoms and further advice.

If you think your child has scarlet fever, please see your GP as soon as possible and make sure that your child takes the full course of any antibiotics prescribed by the doctor. Children should stay at home after starting the antibiotic treatment, to avoid spreading the infection. As long as children are well they can return to school/nursery 24 hours after taking the first dose of antibiotics.
