Maths

Daily Mental Maths Warm Up: Continue to practise counting in 2s! Writing	<p>Watch the short film 'Taking Flight'. https://www.literacyshed.com/takingflight.html# <i>Then choose one (or more!) of the follow activities to do based on the picture:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Draw how Tony is feeling at different points in the film. • Draw or write the story from Tony's point of view. • In the film we do not see the alien, in your story Tony could meet one of them. Describe the alien, and some of the adventures he goes on with Dad and Grandpa. • Continue the story and add in your own adventure. • Find Dad's old diary in the garage - write about one of his adventures with his Dad when he was young.
Reading	<p>Choose a story of your choice. <i>Think about: If there was a sequel to the story, what might happen next?</i> You could use the Oxford Owl website to do this, (you can search by age, level and book type). www.oxfordowl.co.uk/ (Login: Class Name: vfssycamore Password: VFS19)</p> <p>'The 3 Little Pigs Differentiated Reading Comprehension Activity'. This comprehension includes three differentiated levels of questions, including inference and retrieval questions. <i>(Please see attachment)</i></p> <p>Write a book review on either the story you have chosen to read from home or on 'The 3 Little Pigs'. <i>What happens? Was there a moral to the story? Who are the main characters? Who was your favourite character? Why? Did you like the book? What was your favourite part? Why? Would you recommend this book to a friend? Why or why not?</i></p> <p>Phonics: Ruth Miskin (the founder of Read, Write, Inc. phonics) will be doing phonic lessons at home each day via her YouTube channel. Each day she will do Set 1 sounds at 9.30am, Set 2 sounds at 10am and Set 3 sounds at 10.30am. The lessons will stay up for 24 hours and follow the structure of a lesson that your children will be used to from school. Why not follow it up by choosing a book to read from the Oxford Owl (details above). Spelling Focus	<p>Tricky Words: This week we would like you to practise spelling and reading these tricky words:</p> <p style="text-align: center;">you your they be he</p> <p>CHALLENGE: Why not write each word out on a piece of paper and put them on doors around the house. Each time you go into the room you have to read the word and use it in a sentence.</p> <p>You could also complete the attached activity based around these words. (<i>see attached learning named 'spelling focus'</i>)</p>
Topic	<p>This week we would like you to continue with your project on 'My Community'. Please see the attachment for ideas, this was also placed in the home learning pack you were sent home with.</p> <p>Vocabulary Challenge – Continue to look at the words for our next topic. Can you find out the definitions of these words? Can you use them in the context of a sentence?</p>
Mindfulness	<p>Scavenger Hunt – Have a look at the two scavenger hunts (<i>see attached</i>), and see how many things you can find on the list! When you have completed it, why not write out your own one for someone else to complete?</p> <p>Indoor option – A number of children are getting creative at home and making cards/posters for those who are still at work (e.g. NHS staff, carers, supermarket workers, delivery drivers – the list goes on!). Why not make a card thanking them for all their hard work over the past few weeks? Your parents could drop it into the shop the next time they go, or if isolating, display it in your window for others to see to cheer them up.</p>
