Reading	<ul> <li>Read a story of your choice – you can read one from home or visit the Oxford Owl website (you can search by age, level and book type). www.oxfordowl.co.uk/ (Login: Class Name: vfsbeech Password: VFS19) <i>Who are the main characters? Who was your favourite character? Why?</i></li> <li>Reading Comprehension: Did you know that the Queen has owned over 30 corgis and that she trained as a mechanic in the war? Find out these and more fascinating facts with this differentiated set of fact files and reading comprehension questions. There are three different levels, so pick the one you would like to have a go at (you do not have to do all three!) Challenge: Why not have a go at creating your own comprehension questions based on the 'Queen Elizabeth II' text for somebody else in your family to answer?</li> </ul>

The spelling strategy list will remind you of fun ways to practise your spellings (<i>see attached</i>).</li> <li>Punctuation Types: Punctuation is key to ensuring your writing is clear. Without full stops, question marks, and commas, it becomes hard to convey a message with any clarity. Use the differentiated punctuation worksheets (<i>see learning attached</i>) to revise when to use particular forms of punctuation.</li> </ul>
